Hello GLYC Family,

It has been nice seeing such great turnouts over the last month for dinners and the soft grand opening of our new venue downstairs. Those of you that have been to the club have noticed that the reconstruction of the marina is finally underway. We have had a few members inquire about marina slips. If you are interested in a slip, I encourage you to reserve one just as soon as possible as the season is upon us and people are itching to get back out on the water.

We are finalizing the new pricing for 2021 along with the deposit information that will be required to reserve all slips moving forward. This information will be made available to club members just as soon as possible. We have also had members inquire about utilizing boat lifts. The Board is currently finalizing pricing for boatlift installation. This will not only be a direct cost to the owner of the boat but contracting will also be between the owner and contractor. Please understand, we are not saying members are required to utilize this preferred contractor; however, our hopes are to make this process easier for all and to allow for a group rate discount to members. Should you choose to utilize a different contractor, I ask that your contractor contact me directly to ensure we are meeting all the standards necessary to protect our new marina.

In regards to the boat ramp, this is now open for use by members. It is important for all to remember to be mindful of the construction taking place in this area. We are awaiting some cleanup and grading work to be completed around the Smith House and boat ramp area along with the Sail Locker area. We are also waiting for additional materials to be delivered so that we may continue our rebuild efforts of the dock around the boat ramp area.

Our Dry Storage area is now full and a waiting list has been started. We ask that members who utilize dry storage slips move their boats from the trailer parking lot to their dry storage location. We understand that this area is still in some disarray due to the construction; however, we ask for your cooperation with this request. Should you have any questions or concerns with this matter, please contact me directly. We have had a few instances where members who do not have dry storage spots have dropped off trailers and boats onsite. As parking is at a premium for our members we ask that should you need such parking that you contact the Rear Commodore in advance to minimize any inconveniences.

Lastly, the marina contractor crew has tried to be respectful in regards to our limited space. Any questions or concerns with this should be directed to me directly. We are looking forward to another exciting month and to seeing everyone at the club.

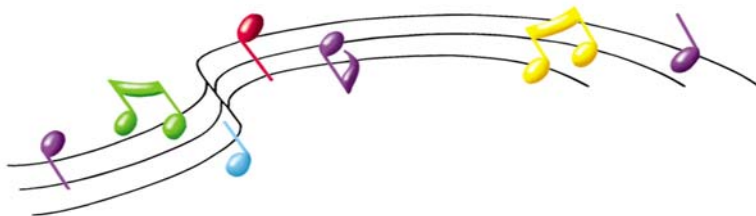

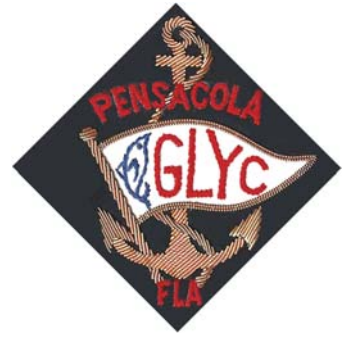

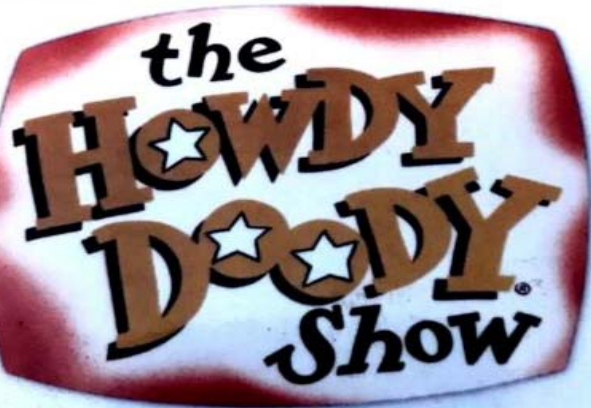

HOUSE RULES

1. Register their guests and be accountable for their conduct. Guest **MUST** be accompanied by the house member.
2. Be appropriately dressed in the club. No bathing suits, tank tops, or bare feet in the clubhouse. Be at least casually dressed in good taste during the dining room hours.
3. Observe current opening and closing hours as posted.
4. Refrain from offensive language, conduct, or intoxication. (if offensive, a member may be asked to leave the premises by club management or on duty personnel and is expected to do so at once)
5. Refrain from going behind the bar or entering the galley during operation or otherwise interfering with bar/galley functions.
6. Purchase all alcoholic beverages to be consumed on premises from the bar.
7. Be accountable for the conduct of their children. Children are not allowed at the bar other than the service station for the purchase of soft drinks or other sundries. They must leave the area immediately after their purchase.
8. Refrain from littering on the premises.
9. Members are accountable for their pets and their conduct. Pets must be on a short leash and in designated areas at all times. Designated areas included downstairs, parking lot, and upper deck on the east side only.
10. Do not take club property (eg. glassware, china, silverware, etc.) beyond the dock.
11. Refrain from smoking, including e-tobacco products or “vaping”, or use of all other tobacco products inside the clubhouse.

Members should be aware that:

1. These rules are enforceable by any board member, manager, or Flag Officer present.
2. Any previous member who has left The Club **NOT** in good standing cannot be a guest of another member.
3. Delinquency in financial obligations will result in denial of club privileges and possible expulsion from The Club.
4. Any complaints, requests, or suggestions must be directed to The Board in writing.
5. Violations of any of the above rules will result in action by the Board of Governors concerning the member(s) involved. The member(s) will be allowed a hearing and the Board of Governors action may be appealed. However, if the member(s) in question is on the Board, he/she will not be allowed to vote in the appeal.
6. Rules will be posted at all times.
