Greetings to the GLYC family.

Well there are still a lot of things happening around the club. Unfortunately we still have a bit of a mess on the property. This looks like it should be shaping up in the very near future. The **boat docks** are looking good as the main walkway and the T-Dock are nearing completion. It is looking like we should have an area for boats to pull up to during the Hargraves Fishing Rodeo. The **boat ramp** has been very active during the weekends. The patience of everyone is appreciated in the working together with the challenges of maneuvering and parking their boat trailers during this time of disarray. The **sail locker** is set to be painted soon. Maybe we can manage to get the area around it cleaned up and made more useful for getting to the boat trailers in its vicinity. Speaking of maneuvering boats, there is an obstruction just south west of the boat ramp. This is a piece of a boat. It is marked with a white boat fender. This piece of boat is about 12 to 14 feet long and runs southeast toward the boat slip area from the floating fender. It is advised that you favor the pilings to the East when coming into or out of the boat ramp. This is scheduled to be removed.

**Thank you to members that have commented about things getting done around the club.** This is much appreciated. The front entrance area to the club looks very nice with the recent landscaping work. The floating playground is in the process of being rehabbed and should be in the water soon. We can then start moving some things around on the beach and getting that area cleaned up. The process of getting a new playground set on the beach has begun. However, like many other things these days, it is not easy to get. My goal is to be doing cleanup days during the week before the Hargraves. I am unfortunately out of town on an extended trip. However striving to be back by the 11th of June so that I can spend time working at the club that week.

The summer months are upon us and soon everyone's eyes will be focused on what is going on in the Atlantic. I guess that I will be sending out an email for volunteers to be on a Dock Committee. The actual boat dock will be less challenging to prepare now that we have went with some flow through sections in the main walkway. There of course will still be some things needed to prepare the property in the event of a storm. Speaking of this, **the new dock rates have been set and should be made available to members.** Along with this, we are needing to come up with added guidelines to people that have boats in the slips. Guidelines such as to when to evacuate the marina.

There has been a great amount of traffic at the club during the week and weekend events. Thanks to an amazing staff for making this happen for us.

Membership is steadily on the rise. We hope to see more members enjoying the club and property as it continues to improve. As always, please feel free to contact me direct for any comments, questions or if I can be of any assistance.

## From the Fleet Captain



Hey, the weather beautiful and the water is warm, excellent time to get out sailing!

The **Sail Loft** doors were installed and the sail loft will be set up and inventoried very soon. If you want to take out a small sailboat (Sunfish or Hobie Getaway), please contact one of our sail committed folks and get checked out on how to rig it properly. If you want some instruction, that is available also!

**Boat Safety Checks** were completed over a couple of weekends and we had several boats checked and awarded the certificate. If we have more interest in the future to have more checks please let me know.

**Raft UP!** GLYC is planning a one-day raft up in Grand Lagoon on July 24, 2021 from 10 AM to 3 PM. We had to move the June date for the raft up because of a scheduling conflict. This raft up is for all power and sail boats that can make it across the lagoon to Redfish Point. Due to crowded conditions on the weekends we will stay well clear of the Ft McRee cove. Boaters can anchor in 2-3 feet of water, or beach their boats and wade out to the raft up. Power boaters will form the base of the raft up - all are reminded to bring plenty of fenders! The plan is to arrive mid-morning, have a leisurely lunch, and then return home by late afternoon. If the weather is inclement we will move the Raft Up back to a week in August.

Since GLYC has not had a Raft UP in several years, we want as many power boats and sail boats as possible. Any members that don't have boats, or much experience, that still want to participate, please sign up at the Club and we will try and match you up with available spaces on boats. Any boats with "extra seats" available, please also sign up at the Club, and we will try to fill your empty seats. This is a great way to get more people involved on the water, plus you may make some new friends at the club!

**Sail Camp:** Sail Camp is coming again this year - scheduled for July 6,7, and 8. This free sail camp is open to all member's children and grand-children, ages 8 to 14. No prior experience is necessary. We will be putting up our sign-up sheets and additional information the first week of June. We will also be looking for volunteers to help out with the program. Stay tuned!

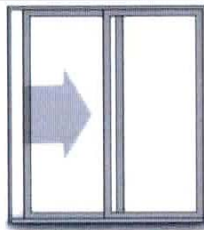

# **GRAND LAGOON YACHT CLUB**

## **HOUSE RULES**

1. Register their guests and be accountable for their conduct. Guest **MUST** be accompanied by the house member.
2. Be appropriately dressed in the club. No bathing suits, tank tops, or bare feet in the clubhouse. Be at least casually dressed in good taste during the dining room hours.
3. Observe current opening and closing hours as posted.
4. Refrain from offensive language, conduct, or intoxication. (if offensive, a member may be asked to leave the premises by club management or on duty personnel and is expected to do so at once)
5. Refrain from going behind the bar or entering the galley during operation or otherwise interfering with bar/galley functions.
6. Purchase all alcoholic beverages to be consumed on premises from the bar.
7. Be accountable for the conduct of their children. Children are not allowed at the bar other than the service station for the purchase of soft drinks or other sundries. They must leave the area immediately after their purchase.
8. Refrain from littering on the premises.
9. Members are accountable for their pets and their conduct. Pets must be on a short leash and in designated areas at all times. Designated areas included downstairs, parking lot, and upper deck on the east side only.
10. Do not take club property (eg. glassware, china, silverware, etc.) beyond the dock.
11. Refrain from smoking, including e-tobacco products or “vaping”, or use of all other tobacco products inside the clubhouse.

### Members should be aware that:

1. These rules are enforceable by any board member, manager, or Flag Officer present.
2. Any previous member who has left The Club **NOT** in good standing cannot be a guest of another member.
3. Delinquency in financial obligations will result in denial of club privileges and possible expulsion from The Club.
4. Any complaints, requests, or suggestions must be directed to The Board in writing.
5. Violations of any of the above rules will result in action by the Board of Governors concerning the member(s) involved. The member(s) will be allowed a hearing and the Board of Governors action may be appealed. However, if the member(s) in question is on the Board, he/she will not be allowed to vote in the appeal.
6. Rules will be posted at all times.
