Hello All,

Well as the year clips along toward the end, we have still been lucky with the storms. With the south parking lot graded, we have a few improvements that we are working on. On this weekends' work day, we hope to do a thorough cleaning of the property to include the debris left by the sail locker and the weed line behind the dry slips. Hopefully we will have enough help to get some boats situated and to place the lines for each parking spot. We plan to be doing some grading work on the east side of the building in preparation of laying grass in that area. Hopefully this will slow down or stop the erosion. Nevertheless, I think the property will be a much nicer sight when viewed from the deck.

As far as the boats being rearranged, we hope that we can make the parking area more navigable by moving some boats around. Some of you have mentioned that you wanted or needed to keep your spots. We totally respect this.

As far as dry slips, we have one available. I have called the next person on the list and they have declined. I have not yet called the next person on the list due to the boats all being misplaced at this time. But I will be calling this week before the work day. Therefore, it will probably be taken. We do have a member that will be taking his boat away for the winter months. He is willing to pay to keep it. However, if someone wants to fill that spot for the winter months with hopes that one will become available or that this member does not bring his boat back, then please let me know.

We have two wet slips on the west side available that have full electric. There is one that does not have electricity. We are able to get 15 amp service to this one to plug in a battery charger if needed. We are getting inquiries for the east slips. We have a couple members that are boat shopping for bigger boats that will go into some of these.

That's about it for me. I am looking forward to seeing all at the Halloween Party and during the holidays at the club. As always many thanks to the Staff for continuing to be awesome!

GRAND LAGOON YACHT CLUB

HOUSE RULES

1. Register their guests and be accountable for their conduct. Guest **MUST** be accompanied by the house member.
2. Be appropriately dressed in the club. No bathing suits, tank tops, or bare feet in the clubhouse. Be at least casually dressed in good taste during the dining room hours.
3. Observe current opening and closing hours as posted.
4. Refrain from offensive language, conduct, or intoxication. (if offensive, a member may be asked to leave the premises by club management or on duty personnel and is expected to do so at once)
5. Refrain from going behind the bar or entering the galley during operation or otherwise interfering with bar/galley functions.
6. Purchase all alcoholic beverages to be consumed on premises from the bar.
7. Be accountable for the conduct of their children. Children are not allowed at the bar other than the service station for the purchase of soft drinks or other sundries. They must leave the area immediately after their purchase.
8. Refrain from littering on the premises.
9. Members are accountable for their pets and their conduct. Pets must be on a short leash and in designated areas at all times. Designated areas included downstairs, parking lot, and upper deck on the east side only.
10. Do not take club property (eg. glassware, china, silverware, etc.) beyond the dock.
11. Refrain from smoking, including e-tobacco products or “vaping”, or use of all other tobacco products inside the clubhouse.

Members should be aware that:

1. These rules are enforceable by any board member, manager, or Flag Officer present.
2. Any previous member who has left The Club **NOT** in good standing cannot be a guest of another member.
3. Delinquency in financial obligations will result in denial of club privileges and possible expulsion from The Club.
4. Any complaints, requests, or suggestions must be directed to The Board in writing.
5. Violations of any of the above rules will result in action by the Board of Governors concerning the member(s) involved. The member(s) will be allowed a hearing and the Board of Governors action may be appealed. However, if the member(s) in question is on the Board, he/she will not be allowed to vote in the appeal.
6. Rules will be posted at all times.
