From the Fleet Captain



Hey, Everyone! Sailing Season has started and as usual in March, the weather has been erratic! That's ok, it's still great to be on the water again and see so many members turn out to watch and participate! The Club has been quite busy lately so there is a lot to report on:

Thanks to Scott and Stan, the 8 slot Kayak Rack has been rebuilt and is ready to be filled up! The Kayak Rack is on the western edge of the property down near the water. It's limited to only six (6) personal kayaks on a first come, first serve basis. The Kayak Rack Rules have been approved by the Board and are posted in the Club and the Sail Loft, and are posted separately here in the Lagoon Lines for your convenience. If you want to place your kayak on the rack, please see the front office for availability.

Thanks to a generous donation, GLYC now has two, single person, kayaks available for all members to use. These kayaks will be stored on the kayak rack and can be checked out by signing up in the Sail Loft. Keys to the locks and paddles are also in the Sail Loft. As usual for all GLYC vessels, members must wear a suitable life jacket at all times while on the water. A large collection of life jackets (all sizes) are available in the Sail Locker.

As you probably noticed, we've placed the Flying Scot sailboat at the entrance, and are in the process of cleaning it up and decorating it so that it welcomes members and guests to the Club! Thanks to many folks including Pete, Bill, Tom, Greg, Jim and others for helping in getting the boat on the pilings. Special thanks to Mark for taking the lead in the project and wielding the chain saw for many hours to set the boat up just right. We will now turn the project over to the Crappy Crafters to complete the decoration and make it look classy. Thanks in advance to you folks for your hard work and ingenuity!

Once we took the Flying Scot off the trailer, we then transformed that trailer into a first class multi-boat trailer to take the GLYC sailing team to local events. Thanks to Jim, Mark, Greg, Tom, and Pete for your hard work and good ideas! In transforming the trailer The sunfish trailer is capable of moving up to 3 sunfish or laser sailboats at one time to a local race. The trailer is available to all members who need to move their small sailboats. Please contact the Fleet Captain for details on how to check out the trailer.

Members are reminded to always keep safety first while on the water. We just started sailing up again, and we've already had our first Search and Rescue case of the year. Some members checked out the Hobie Getaway and sailed down to the Navy Cove in very light winds. While they were there the winds really piped up and the group of sailors ended up ripping out the mainsail trying to get back. Because the sailors let us know before they left where they were going, we were able to determine they had a problem and mounted a rescue to tow the Getaway back to the club. Many thanks to Shaun for the use of his very nice boat, and to his friend Mike, Tom and Pete to help with the rescue. Sailing is always fun, but we also need to keep safety and the changing weather conditions always in our mind!

The Coast Guard Auxiliary is coming to GLYC the first two Saturdays in May from 9 AM to 12 noon to provide courtesy boating checks (May 7 & 14). Courtesy checks are non-punitive in nature. If you have all the proper safety gear and documents, you will be issued a sticker for your windshield that indicates you passed in 2022. This is for all boats, sail and power, and all sizes. They'll be able to inspect boats on a trailer or in the water.

Sail Camp this Summer will be held July 5 thru 8 for all kids 8 to 14 years old! No prior experience is required. It's also FREE! Much more information to follow! Sail Safe!

Grand Lagoon Yacht Club Kayak Rack Rules

1. A total of 6 kayak slots are available to all GLYC members on a first come, first served basis. Members are reminded that Florida Law requires that a life jacket must be attached to the kayak or on the operator at all times while on the water.
2. Kayak rack users will be charged \$10 per slot per month. Limit to two slots per member number. Contact the front office and give them your name, member number and the number of kayaks you will be using. The office will add the monthly charge to your bill.
3. Members must have their name, phone and member number clearly and permanently marked on the kayak. Contact the Fleet Captain to obtain permanent name tags if you need them.
4. Members must supply a suitable locking system to ensure their kayak is secure for general weather.
5. Members must remove kayaks during heavy weather or any time a mandatory evacuation is called.
6. Members are responsible for any damage their kayaks cause if they do not remove them during heavy weather.
7. Members agree that their locking system can be cut in the event of a mandatory evacuation and they are unable to remove their kayaks.
8. GLYC will use two slots for Club kayaks. These kayaks are for member use and can be checked out on the sign-up list in the Sail Loft. Keys to the locks and paddles are located in the Sail Loft. Contact the Fleet Captain for more information.
9. Members using GLYC Club kayaks must wear an appropriate life jacket at all times while on the water.

HOUSE RULES

1. Register their guests and be accountable for their conduct. Guests **MUST** be accompanied by the house member.
2. Be appropriately dressed in the club. No bathing suits, tank tops, or bare feet in the clubhouse. Be at least casually dressed in good taste during the dining room hours.
3. Observe current opening and closing hours as posted.
4. Refrain from offensive language, conduct, or intoxication. (if offensive, a member may be asked to leave the premises by club management or on duty personnel and is expected to do so at once)
5. Refrain from going behind the bar or entering the galley during operation or otherwise interfering with bar/galley functions.
6. Purchase all alcoholic beverages to be consumed on premises from the bar.
7. Be accountable for the conduct of their children. Children are not allowed at the bar other than the service station for the purchase of soft drinks or other sundries. They must leave the area immediately after their purchase.
8. Refrain from littering on the premises.
9. Members are accountable for their pets and their conduct. Pets must be on a short leash and in designated areas at all times. Designated areas included downstairs, parking lot, and upper deck on the east side only.
10. Do not take club property (eg. glassware, china, silverware, etc.) beyond the dock.
11. Refrain from smoking, including e-tobacco products or “vaping”, or use of all other tobacco products inside the clubhouse.
12. The butcher, the baker, and the candlestick-maker may not sail out to sea.

Members should be aware that:

1. These rules are enforceable by any board member, manager, or Flag Officer present.
2. Any previous member who has left The Club **NOT** in good standing cannot be a guest of another member.
3. Delinquency in financial obligations will result in denial of club privileges and possible expulsion from The Club.
4. Any complaints, requests, or suggestions must be directed to The Board in writing.
5. Violations of any of the above rules will result in action by the Board of Governors concerning the member(s) involved. The member(s) will be allowed a hearing and the Board of Governors action may be appealed. However, if the member(s) in question is on the Board, he/she will not be allowed to vote in the appeal.
6. Rules will be posted at all times.
