From the Fleet Captain



Hey, everyone! Sailing Season has kicked off with a Bang and May looks like it will be even better!

First item: Sail Training Day is May 7, 2022 from 10 AM until whenever! Anyone interested in going sailing, learning about sailing, or just wanting to ride on a sailboat, come on down and we'll get you on the water! We'll have several larger boats rigged up that can get on with an instructor. If you think you're ready to head out on your own on a sunfish or a laser, we'll help you rig it up and get you going. Basically, this is a chance for folks at any level of sailing experience to get out with the group and get on the water. We look forward to sailing with you!

May 7th and 14th are also the dates for the Coast Guard Auxiliary to be at GLYC to perform safety checks of your boat. To be complete, you'll need to make sure your registration and insurance are current (which you need anyway for Scott to have on file!) Your life jackets, fire extinguishers and sound producing devices also need to be in good shape and current. If your boat is not quite ready, the inspectors will give you a checklist of items you will need in case you get boarded by the Coast Guard or the Florida Marine Patrol. This could save you some bucks if you get boarded! The inspections both days are free and no tickets will be issued. This is for all boats, sail and power, on a trailer or in the water.

Member that are using the Kayak rack are reminded to make sure they have their name and phone number somewhere on the kayak, and have checked in with the office to ensure availability. If you need an identification sticker, check with me, we have plenty!

Another reminder, GLYC now has two single person kayaks available for all members to use. These kayaks are stored on the kayak rack and can be checked out by signing up in the Sail Loft. Keys to the locks and paddles are also in the Sail Loft. As usual for all GLYC vessels, members must wear a suitable life jacket at all times while on the water. A large collection of life jackets (all sizes) are available in the Sail Locker.

Congrats to Mark and Pete for competing in the GYA Laser Gulf Coast Championships. The competition was fierce, and the wind was blowing hard! It was a workout just to finish all the races in two days. Thanks guys for representing GLYC!

Sail Camp this Summer will be held July 5 thru 8 for all kids 8 to 14 years old! No prior experience is required. It's also FREE! Much more information to follow!

GRAND LAGOON YACHT CLUB

HOUSE RULES

1. Register their guests and be accountable for their conduct. Guests **MUST** be accompanied by the house member.
2. Be appropriately dressed in the club. No bathing suits, tank tops, or bare feet in the clubhouse. Be at least casually dressed in good taste during the dining room hours.
3. Observe current opening and closing hours as posted.
4. Refrain from offensive language, conduct, or intoxication. (if offensive, a member may be asked to leave the premises by club management or on duty personnel and is expected to do so at once)
5. Refrain from going behind the bar or entering the galley during operation or otherwise interfering with bar/galley functions.
6. Purchase all alcoholic beverages to be consumed on premises from the bar.
7. Be accountable for the conduct of their children. Children are not allowed at the bar other than the service station for the purchase of soft drinks or other sundries. They must leave the area immediately after their purchase.
8. Refrain from littering on the premises.
9. Members are accountable for their pets and their conduct. Pets must be on a short leash and in designated areas at all times. Designated areas included downstairs, parking lot, and upper deck on the east side only.
10. Do not take club property (eg. glassware, china, silverware, etc.) beyond the dock.
11. Refrain from smoking, including e-tobacco products or “vaping”, or use of all other tobacco products inside the clubhouse.

Members should be aware that:

1. These rules are enforceable by any board member, manager, or Flag Officer present.
2. Any previous member who has left The Club NOT in good standing cannot be a guest of another member.
3. Delinquency in financial obligations will result in denial of club privileges and possible expulsion from The Club.
4. Any complaints, requests, or suggestions must be directed to The Board in writing.
5. Violations of any of the above rules will result in action by the Board of Governors concerning the member(s) involved. The member(s) will be allowed a hearing and the Board of Governors action may be appealed. However, if the member(s) in question is on the Board, he/she will not be allowed to vote in the appeal.
6. Rules will be posted at all times.
