Hello all. This month flew by! My gosh! However, I know that all of us are looking for a beautiful spring and a great summer of fun. The club and boat ramp should be getting busier soon. In the marina, the west side is full as far as the slips that have power. There is one that does not have power. I spoke with the electrician and was told that it would not be a big deal to add power to it.

On the east side of the marina we have 7 available, with one more coming available in April.

Of course members are always welcome to leave their boat in a slip for a short term if needed. Please let me or a board member know if you plan on doing so.

Well that's all for me. Huge thanks to the wonderful staff for always making things amazing.

Hey, everyone! Sailing is Back! Wednesday afternoon sailing has started, and we're back on the water, again! If you want to join us, just show up around 3 PM in clothing you don't mind getting wet, and some type of beach shoe for launching the boats. We have plenty of life jackets available. We'll show you how to rig the boats, how to sail them, and how to put them away properly. Our Hobie Getaway is almost back together and available for use, however, we're still waiting on the mast for Capri 16.5. It has shipped but I don't have a firm arrival date for that as yet. As soon as the mast shows up, we'll have the Capri ready for action again! But we still have plenty of sunfish and lasers to sail, and if you'd like to go out on other boats just let us know!

We've set the date for Youth Sail Camp again for July 5, 6, and 7, 2023. It will only be 3 days this year because of how July 4th falls on a Tuesday, but we can still get some great sailing in for these kids. Sailors must be between 8 and 14 years old, have their own life jacket and beach shoes for the camp. We will get sign up lists and more information posted starting in May. We had a great class last year, and every sailor soloed on the Sunfish, which is a first for our classes. So we're expecting great things this summer, too!

You may have noticed some changes on the Sunfish and the Cat beach – there are orange chains sticking up out of the sand. Due to the severe wind event we experienced in January, the Board has directed that we develop an anchor system for all the boats on the beach. We installed very large screw sand anchors with heavy orange chains for visibility so that you can secure the boats when not in use. You can still keep private boats, such as sunfish, lasers, and small beach catamarans on the Club beach, however, we ask everyone to have them strapped down when you leave. If you want to put your boat on the Club beach, please see me for details.

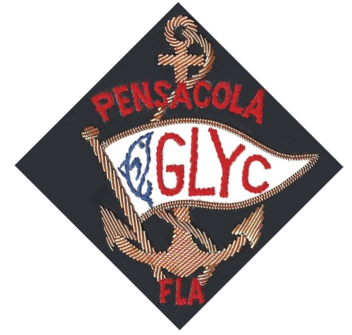

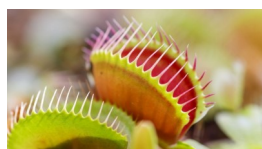

GRAND LAGOON YACHT CLUB

HOUSE RULES

1. Members are responsible for signing in their non-member guests. The GLYC member shall be responsible for the guest's conduct, and the guest shall leave when the member leaves.
2. Non-members that are not the immediate family of a member will be allowed in the Club no more than six times per year. Members of other reciprocal yacht clubs, providing proof of membership, are not considered guests. Transients temporarily renting a slip are allowed access to the club during the rental period. Frequent guests will be encouraged to join the club. The Board will review abuse of this rule and take action.
3. Prior members who have resigned from the Club and were not in good standing cannot be a guest of another member.
4. A person whom a member is dating is considered a guest, but the date may use the facilities of the Club as often as the date is accompanied by the member, provided that the date abides by all the rules and regulations of the Club.
5. Be appropriately dressed in the club. No bathing suits, tank tops, or bare feet in the clubhouse. Be at least casually dressed in good taste during the dining room hours.
6. Observe current opening and closing hours as posted.
7. Refrain from offensive language, conduct, or intoxication. If offensive, a member may be asked to leave the premises by club management or a Flag officer and is expected to do so at once.
8. Refrain from going behind the bar, entering the galley during operation, or otherwise interfering with bar/galley functions.
9. Purchase all alcoholic beverages to be consumed on the premises from the bar.
10. Be accountable for the conduct of their children. Children are not allowed at the bar other than the service station for the purchase of soft drinks or other sundries. They must leave the area immediately after their purchase.
11. Refrain from littering on the premises.
12. Members are accountable for their pets and their conduct. Pets must always be on a short leash and in designated areas. Designated areas included downstairs, parking lot, and upper deck on the east side only.
13. Do not take club property (eg. glassware, china, silverware, etc.) beyond the dock.
14. Refrain from smoking, including e-tobacco products, "vaping," or use of all other tobacco products inside the clubhouse.

Members should be aware that:

1. These rules are enforceable by any board member, manager, or Flag Officer present.
2. Delinquency in financial obligations will result in denial of club privileges and possible expulsion from The Club.
4. Any complaints, requests, or suggestions must be directed to The Board in writing.
5. Violations of any of the above rules will result in action by the Board of Governors concerning the member(s) involved. The member(s) will be allowed a hearing and the Board of Governors' action may be appealed. However, if the member(s) in question is on the Board, he/she will not be allowed to vote in the appeal.
6. Rules will be posted at all times.
