### **Dock Rules We All Need to Know**

Whether you have a boat docked in a wet or dry slip - there are dock rules that all members should be aware of and follow:

#### REMEMBER...

- Vehicles parked behind the Club must fit inside the yellow parking to allow for members to launch their boat safely.
- No parking allowed in dry/trailer storage.
- Children under 6 are not allowed on the dock without a life vest or an adult or guardian (16)+ years old who can swim.
- No running, swimming or diving from the dock.
- Diving from the swim platform is not permitted.
- Birds are not to be fed within the Club premises (including the dock).
- Fish cleaning is allowed at designated area on the south end of the main dock.
- Bait, fish, food, dog waste, etc. needs to be sealed in a plastic trash bag and disposed of in the Club's main trash receptacle in North Parking Lot.
- Pets must be short-leashed when on the dock/GLYC property and owners are responsible for cleaning up after their pets.

A complete list of Dock Rules are posted on the bulletin board for review or you can click <u>HERE</u> for a pdf copy. Violations of Dock Rules should be brought to the attention of the Rear Commodore (Scott Walley) or any GLYC Flag Officer who is on site.

Hello All,

Hope all are well. First off, a huge thank you to the volunteers that did the wonderful landscaping job and the work in the lower area with the painting of the columns, the walls and the tables. We will plan to have a clean up day the week before the Hargreaves Rodeo.

Wow, what a busy Memorial Day weekend we had at the club. Along with this came some craziness. As mentioned before, please remember to be mindful of the boat ramp area on land and in the water. We had some people holding up both. Also please be mindful of the trailer parking area. We had people leaving their trucks hooked to their trailer and blocking other dry stored boats. These type of actions are very disrespectful to the club and its members. Remember we have very limited space. Parking is to be treated as a first come first serve basis just as any other boat launch. Unfortunately if there are no trailer parking spots left, then people have to make another plan.

As for the the dry storage area, we still have a waiting list of 5 people. As for the wet slips, we have a waiting list of two for the west side. We only have two slips available on the east side. We do have the three transient slips available. As some know, we recently have had reports of very low water pressure on the dock. This has proven to be a temporary thing. We are thinking it may be happening while the sprinklers are running. We will investigate further.

We recently had some requests to put dock boxes on the main dock. Unfortunately we do not have the space for this on the dock. However, in the next few weeks to come, we plan to clear the area on the south side of the sail locker and make an area for dock boxes. Hopefully this will be helpful to those that have boats in the marina.

Well that's about it for me. Thanks to the wonderful staff that work so hard to take care of us. As always feel free to call on me if I can be of any assistance to anyone.

Debbie Buckley has a birthday on Sunday, June 9th. If you see her around the club please wish her a very happy birthday!





#### House Rules for Grand Lagoon Yacht Club

The Grand Lagoon Yacht Club (The GLYC) and all the facilities of The GLYC are primarily for the use, entertainment, and enjoyment of the members and their families and guests. The House Rules of The GLYC are designed to facilitate and promote this purpose. The House Rules and any additions thereto are established and may be revised by the Board of Governors subject to the direction and approval of the Board of Governors. Members should be aware that:

- These rules are enforceable by any Board Member, Manager or Flag Officer present.
- Delinquency in financial obligations will result in denial of club privileges and possible expulsion from The GLYC.
- Any complaints, requests, or suggestions must be directed to the Board of Governors in writing.
- Violations of any of the rules will result in action by the Board of Governors concerning the member(s) will be allowed a hearing and the Board of Governors' action may be appealed. However, if the member(s) in. Question is on the Board, he/she will not be allowed to vote in the appeal.
- Rules will be posted at all times.

#### **HOUSE RULES** (revised 2/25/2024)

- 1. Members are responsible for signing in their non-member guests. The GLYC member shall be responsible for the guest's conduct, and the guest shall leave when the member leaves The GLYC.
- 2. Non-members that are not the immediate family of a member and live within 50 mile radius of the Club will be allowed in the Club no more than ten (10) times per year. Members of other reciprocal yacht clubs, providing proof of membership, are not considered guests. Transients temporarily renting a slip are allowed access to the club during the rental period. Frequent guests will be encouraged to join the club. When a violation is brought to the attention of the Board, the guest book will be reviewed by two Board members and action will be taken.
- 3. Prior members who have resigned from The GLYC and were not in good standing cannot be a guest of another member.
- 4. A person whom a member is dating is considered a guest, but the date may use the facilities of The GLYC as often as the date is accompanied by the member, provided that the date abides by all the rules and regulations of The GLYC.
- 5. Be appropriately dressed while in the Club. No bathing suits, tank tops, or bare feet in the Club. Be at least casually dressed in good taste during the dining room hours
- 6. Observe current opening and closing hours.
- 7. Refrain from offensive language, conduct, or intoxication. If offensive, a member may be asked to leave the premises by The GLYC management or Flag Officer and is expected to do so at once.
- 8. Refrain from going behind the bar, entering the galley during operation, or otherwise interfering with bar/galley functions.
- 9. Purchase all alcoholic beverages to be consumed on premises from the bar.
- 10. Be accountable for the conduct of your children. Children are not allowed at the bar other than the service station and must leave the area immediately after purchase.
- 11. Refrain from littering on the premises.
- 12. Members are accountable for their pets and their conduct; they must be on a short leash and in designated areas: downstairs, parking lot, east-side of upper deck.
- 13. Do not take club property (eg. Glassware, china, silverware, etc) beyond the dock.
- 14. Refrain from smoking, including e-tobacco products, "vaping," or use of all other tobacco products inside the club house.
