

IT'S GLYC ELECTION SEASON!!

The offices up for the annual election are all the Flag Officers and two Board Members. The responsibilities of these offices are outlined in detail on pages 2 and 3 of the bylaws, but the following are brief excerpts of the descriptions.

General Membership/Slate of Candidates Meeting: Nov 12, 2025

Election: December 10, 2025

Commodore: presides at all official meetings and performs functions as directed by the Board of Governors.

Vice-Commodore: second in command and supervises food and beverage services and all other functions related to the clubhouse operations.

Rear Commodore: third in command and monitors all external operations of the Club, including buildings, grounds, piers, docks, etc.

Fleet Captain: supervise the Club Sailing Committee and maintain club-owned boats, oversee races, regattas, etc.

Secretary: keep records of all official Club meetings, maintain the bulletin boards, produce the monthly newsletter, and other duties as described in Article II, sec 1, para 5 of the bylaws.

Treasurer: monitor all Club income and financial obligations, furnish a monthly financial report to the Board of Governors, and perform other duties related to the office.

Board Member: This office is for a two-year term. Board Members will attend all the monthly Board of Governors meetings and perform such actions as deemed appropriate by the Board.

Complete descriptions from the by-laws will be available near the signup board or from the Election Committee Chair, Countess Guiles. The sign-up sheet for these offices is located in the bar area. Hurry before all the spots are gone! Just kidding. There's still plenty of time before the slate is set at November's General Members meeting.



House Rules for Grand Lagoon Yacht Club

The Grand Lagoon Yacht O ub (The GLYC) and all the facilities of The GLYC are primarily for the use, entertainment, and enjoyment of the members and their families and guests. The House Rules of The GLYC are designed to facilitate and promote this purpose. The House Rules and any additions thereto are established and may be revised by the Board of Governors subject to the direction and approval of the Board of Governors. Members should be aware that:

- These rules are enforceable by any Board Member, Manager or Flag Officer present.
- Delinquency in financial obligations will result in denial of dub privileges and possible expulsion from The GLYC.
- Any complaints, requests, or suggestions must be directed to the Board of Governors in writing.
- Violations of any of the rules will result in action by the Board of Governors concerning the member(s) will be allowed a hearing and the Board of Governors' action may be appealed. However, if the member(s) in. Question is on the Board, he/she will not be allowed to vote in the appeal.
- Rules will be posted at all times.

HOUSE RULES (revise d 2/25/2024)

- Me mbe is are responsible for signing in their non-member guests. The GLYC member shall be responsible for the guest's conduct, and the guest shall leave when
 the member leaves The GLYC.
- Non-members that are not the immediate family of a member and live within 50 mile radius of the Club will be all owed in the Club no more than ten (10) times
 per year. Members of other reciprocal yacht clubs, providing proof of membership, are not considered guests. Transients temporarily renting a slip are allowed
 access to the dub during the rental period. Frequent guests will be encouraged to join the dub. When a violation is brought to the attention of the Board, the
 guest book will be reviewed by two Board members and action will be taken.
- Prior members who have resigned from The GLYC and were not in good standing cannot be aguest of another member.
- A person whom a member is dating is considered a guest, but the date may use the facilities of The GLY Cas often as the date is accompanied by the member, provided that the date a bides by all the rules and regulations of The GLYC.
- Be appropriately dressed while in the Club. No bathing suits, tank tops, or bare feet in the Club. Be at least casually dressed in good taste during the dining room hours.
- Observe current opening and closing hours.
- Refrain from offensive language, conduct, or intoxication. If offensive, a member may be asked to leave the premises by The GLYC management or Flag Officer and is expected to do so at once.
- Refrain from going behind the bar, entering the galley during operation, or otherwise interfering with bar/galley functions.
- 9. Purchase all alcoholic beverages to be consumed on premises from the bar.
- Be accountable for the conduct of your children. Children are not allowed at the bar other than the service station and must leave the area immediately after purchase.
- Refrain from littering on the premises.
- Members are accountable for their pets and their conduct; they must be on as hort leash and in designated areas: downstairs, parking lot, east-side of upper deck.
- Do not take dub property (eq. Glassware, china, silverware, etc) beyond the dock.
- 14. Refrain from smoking, including e-tobacco products, "vaping," or use of all other tobacco products inside the dub house
